

**PENDLETON TOWN BOARD  
REGULAR MEETING  
December 8, 2025**

A Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Pendleton was held at the Town Hall, 6570 Campbell Blvd., Pendleton, NY, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2025, at 7:00 p.m.

Supervisor Maerten called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

## OTHER REPORTS

**Supervisor Maerten** reported that the tax collected for October 2025 was \$195,889.29. This is an increase of \$8,995.56 when compared with October 2024. The year to date received is \$2,168,363.04 which is an increase of \$125,547.77 from 2024.

**Councilman Hickman** stated that this was most likely his final meeting as Councilman and thanked the public, fellow Board members, the Town Clerk, and the Town Supervisor for their support over the years. He expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to serve and stated that he looks forward to seeing the work of the newly elected and recently appointed Councilmembers. Supervisor Maerten thanked Councilman Hickman for his years of service and dedication to the Town.

**Councilman Lombardo** had nothing to report. Supervisor Maerten also thanked Councilman Lombardo for his time, service, and positive impact on the Town.

**Councilman Buechler** reminded the public that the annual Holiday Event is scheduled for the following day and encouraged residents to attend, noting that it has consistently been a well-attended and enjoyable event.

**Councilman Rumbold** reported that he attended a seminar regarding the TAP Grant and stated that he plans to contact the owner of Skylighters to obtain information needed for planning the 2026 Fourth of July event.

**Attorney Joerg** had nothing new to report.

**Engineer Britton** reported that he anticipates providing the finalized contract documents for the Court Resurfacing Project to the Board in the near future.

## DEPARTMENT HEADS

**Town Clerk Maurer** reported that monthly reports were received from the Assessor, Building Inspector, Dog Control Officer, Engineer and Highway Superintendent. These reports, along with the monthly reports for the Town Clerk and Water/Sewer collection, were posted online with the agenda documents.

Next, Mrs. Maurer informed the Board of the following monies received and collected in the month of November, 2025:

Mrs. Maurer further reported that Armored Alarm is expected to begin the Town Hall Network Infrastructure Project by the end of the month, which will result in increased activity at Town Hall.

Mrs. Maurer formally announced that she has filed an official letter of resignation from the office of Town Clerk with the New York State Department of State, effective December 31, 2025. She stated that this decision comes with mixed emotions and that it has been an honor to serve the community for the past eight years. She expressed her gratitude for the support, encouragement, and kindness she has received over the years and stated that she takes great pride in the Town Clerk's Office and in serving the residents and staff of the Town of Pendleton. She concluded by

thanking the public for the privilege of holding the position of Town Clerk and for placing their trust in her.

**Supervisor Maerten** thanked Town Clerk Maurer and Councilmen Hickman and Lombardo for their years of hard work and dedication to the Town.

**Highway Superintendent Fischer** thanked Councilmen Hickman and Lombardo for their service and expressed his appreciation to Mrs. Maurer for the assistance she consistently provided to him and the Highway and Water/Sewer Department staff, noting that she regularly went above and beyond her duties.

**Building Inspector Barnes** reported that New York State has suspended, until further notice, the gas ban that was scheduled to take effect in 2026. He also introduced Don Arnts as the newly appointed part-time Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer.

**Assessor Friert** had nothing to report.

**Recreation Director Covell** thanked Councilman Hickman for appointing him as Recreation Director and thanked Mrs. Maurer for her assistance. He also announced that the Children's Holiday Party is scheduled for Tuesday, December 9th, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.
