WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pendleton did approve by resolution on September 8, 2025 the advertisement of Request for Proposals related to replacement of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning equipment in the Town Hall; and

WHEREAS, the approved Request for Proposal was advertised and all submissions were opened and tabulated by the Town Clerk as specified in the authorizing resolution; and

WHEREAS, bids were reviewed and the lowest bid was approved for a specific unit replacement; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that an additional heating, ventilation, and air condition unit be replaced based on the previously accepted bid for this work.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Pendleton on this 27th day of October 2025, that the proposal submitted by Day 1 Heating and Cooling for \$10,937.00 for replacement of a specific heating, ventilation, and air conditioning unit located in the Town Hall is accepted and approved. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION 287-25

APPROVAL OF PURCHASE OF PLOW PACKAGE

WHEREAS, the Town of Pendleton purchased a truck chassis for the public works operations and the Highway Superintendent has requested authorization for an expenditure to purchase and install a snow plow on this piece of equipment; and

WHEREAS, pricing for the purchase is available through Sourcewell for an amount of \$9,273.46 through a specific vendor; and

WHEREAS, the vendor has provided an additional quote of \$8,050.44 for this work; and

WHEREAS, solicitations for quotes from multiple other vendors for comparison returned one additional quote in excess of the Sourcewell pricing; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the expenditure be authorized based on the Sourcewell pricing and comparable lower quote from a Sourcewell vendor.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Pendleton on this 27th day of October 2025, that purchase and installation of a snow plow package for a Town-owned vehicle is approved from Wilbri for \$8,050.44. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Community Center Change Order – Sicoli

A quote in the amount of \$12,377.25, was submitted by Sicoli Construction Services, Inc., to remove and re-install a door at the Community Center. No motions were made to move forward with this change order.

Motion by Councilman Hickman, seconded by Councilman Lombardo, to enter into an Executive Session with Town Attorney Joerg, Deputy Supervisor Walter, Town Clerk Maurer, and Deputy Town Clerk Lemma, to discuss personnel matters in the Town Clerk's office, at 7:28 p.m. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman Buechler, seconded by Councilman Rumbold, to adjourn from the Executive Session at 7:55 p.m. Motion carried.

BOARD DISCUSSION

Councilman Rumbold reported that he recently spoke with Engineer Britton regarding the improvements needed for the Town Park tennis courts. A discussion followed concerning the new set of plans that Mr. Britton provided at the meeting, which included alternate layout options for consideration. Further discussion will be required before any final decisions are made.

Councilman Hickman stated that he and Highway Superintendent Fischer discussed the potential need for a splash park attendant. Supervisor Maerten noted that he will prepare a resolution addressing this matter.

Councilman Buechler commented that he recently visited the Town Park with his grandson and commended the repairs made to the merry-go-round, noting that it looks and operates very nicely.

Town Clerk Maurer reported an issue with bees in the Town Hall break room and requested assistance in having the matter resolved. She also announced that the Pendleton Veterans Association (PVA) will hold its annual Wreath Laying Ceremony on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, at 11:00 a.m. at the PVA monument outside Town Hall. The guest speaker will be NYS Assemblyman Paul Bologna, and all are welcome to attend. In addition, she shared an invitation with the Town Board to the November meeting of the Niagara County Municipal Clerks Association (NCMCA), which she will be hosting.

PUBLIC REMARKS/COMMENTS

A resident asked whether the Town has a written policy regarding the use of restrictive reserve funds. Supervisor Maerten responded that he would need to follow up with an answer.

Another resident asked several questions regarding the modified contract with the Senior Citizens Club, including:

- Whether there is a cap on the amount of insurance the Town pays;
- If so, what the cap amount is; and
- Whether the insurance payment is included in the \$10,000 allocated for the club.

No other public remarks or comments were made.

Motion by Councilman Buechler, seconded by Councilman Rumbold, to adjourn from the Work Session at 8:07 p.m. Motion carried.
